## **Course Description**

This course in economic geography uses a format in which topical questions are posed and debated. It considers relationships between economy and space through a focus on development. It emphasizes the geopolitical and cultural backdrops to development amid debates about globalization, international trade, and investment. It introduces the distinctive identity of economic geography then focuses on broad structural and regulatory processes, asking how they shape the uneven development of economic landscapes across space, and on key structures of economic life: the capitalist system, governments, firms, and technology. The course also examines the various processes that organize the economy (the transnational corporation, labor's power in the economy, commodity chains); and explores economic lives, bringing in dimensions of culture, gender, and ethnicity in understanding the spatial organization of economic activity.
