Course Description

Much of psychology concerns itself with what is happening inside the head or brain. Behavior analysis, by contrast, insists that much of the explanation for behavior, and the leverage to change it, can be found in the analysis of the context in which it develops and occurs. This course explores that theory and basic principles of behavior analysis, and its application to clinical populations. Topics include the three-term contingency as a basic unit of analysis, single-subject designs, functional analysis; applied interventions, verbal behavior, rule-governed behavior, stimulus equivalence, and self-control.
