## Course Description

Climate crisis and the COVID-19 pandemic are asking us to find new ways of knowing, caring for, and relating to the world. Anthropologists are increasingly paying attention to the human-nonhuman relations that constitute the more-than-human anthropocene, and different forms of knowledge to tackle the crisis of the imagination.
