#### **Course Description**

This course offers an introduction, theoretical overview, and analytical approach to race and gender and considers what work the concepts of gender and race might do for us in a critical - specifically feminist and antiracist - struggle. The class focuses on sociological understandings of intersectionality and related concepts, and explores how the intersections of gender, race, sexuality, and class can produce and reproduce inequalities. Grounding the discussions in black feminist thought, the module provides a comprehensive body of knowledge, including the effects of interlocking oppressions (Crenshaw 1993), how the concepts of gender and race are implicated in a broad range of social phenomena beyond the sexual and racial difference, the power of counter-narrative, and accounts of situated lived-experience.
