## Course Description

This course provides an overview of the history, aesthetics, and cultural politics of cinema in India (the country that produces the highest number of films in the world), with a special focus on the Hindi cinema produced in Bombay (Mumbai) and consumed around the world under the label of Bollywood. Throughout its history, Indian cinema has attracted audiences across its borders, assimilated a wide range of global cinematic influences, and prevented Hollywood from making inroads into its home territory. The course focuses on the interplay between the national and the transnational in the making of Indian film cultures during two crucial periods of transformation.
