Course Description

This course is to traces and contextualizes the birth and development of post-Independence sub-Saharan African cinema in the 1960s-70s. From both a historical and cinematic perspective, it examines the ways in which this key period shaped emerging filmmaking trends in Africa, foregrounding the questions of identity and representation. Alternating the viewing and analysis of a corpus of six emblematic 60s and 70s feature films, the course studies the socio-political and cultural contexts of this postcolonial cinema, its influences, themes, and aesthetics. The films studied in this course are: AFRIQUE SUR SEINE by Paulin S Vieyra (1955), BOROM SARRET by Ousmane Sembène (Senegal, 1963), XALA by Ousmane Sembène (Senegal, 1974), BAARA by Souleymane Cissé (Mali, 1977), KADDU BEYKAT (LETTRE PAYSANNE) by Safi Faye (Senegal, 1975), MUNA MOTO by Jean-Pierre Dikongue Pipa (Cameroon, 1975), TOUKI-BOUKI by Djibril Diop Mambety (Senegal, 1973).
