Texts by Alexis de Tocqueville, Karl Marx, Max Weber, Emile Durkheim, and Georg Simmel provide key insights into such areas of social life as the economy, politics, religion, culture, and urban life; and basic conceptual tools to help understand power, stratification, social organization, solidarity, and the nature of modernity.
