## Course Description

This course explores sociological perspectives on education and schooling, with a particular emphasis on how experiences of schooling are affected by variables such as social class, gender, ethnicity, and sexuality. Formal schooling systems play a vital role in both shaping individual and collective identities and in reflecting and reinforcing dominant societal values.

Students examine the question, "What is education for?" and consider the micro-politics of everyday school life, focusing on the relationship between schooling and individual identity themes such as the body, space and time, masculinities and femininities, and sexualities.
