Course Description

This course examines how medieval people thought about, performed, and experienced gender between the years 1000-1500. After an introduction to medieval ideas about the body and gendered difference, students explore a range of topics, such as power relations between medieval men and women; how intersectional considerations of gender help us to understand better cross-cultural and/or interfaith interactions; and how normative genders and sexualities were produced by medieval thinkers through their definition of the transgressive. In addition to gaining confidence in the analysis of medieval source material, students study conceptual frameworks used by historians to understand gender and sexuality in past societies.
