## **Course Description**

This course covers public international law: how it is made, how it relates to national legal systems, and how disputes arise and how they are settled. It examines the shape and content of the international legal system and who has rights and responsibilities under it. Students explore the role of international courts and tribunals and their impact on the development of international law. A range of international law topics are addressed, with an emphasis on contemporary challenges, including: statehood and recognition, self-determination and statehood, jurisdiction and immunities, the use of force, international human rights law, trade and investment, and the law of the sea.
