### **Course Description**

The main goal of this course is to provide a detailed understanding of impact evaluation methods, with a focus on randomized evaluations. Many of the topics covered, such as measuring outcomes and dealing with threats to the validity of an impact evaluation, are relevant for different impact evaluation methods. The main topics that are addressed include: when is a rigorous evaluation of social impact needed; the common pitfalls of evaluations and how does randomization helps; the key components of a good randomized evaluation design; how to determine the appropriate sample size, how to measure outcomes, and how to manage data; the main difficulties when dealing with practitioners; the main difficulties when analyzing the results; how to make results useful for policy makers. The course presents material through interactive lectures and case studies using examples from completed or ongoing impact evaluations in education/development economics.
