Course Description

This course clarifies the various aspects of the transformation of contemporary Japanese law and society by picking up major topics of general theory of sociology of law, law interpretation and sociology of law, state law and customary law, court functioning, law consciousness, market economics and law, and peculiarity and universality of Japanese law. This lecture provides fundamental knowledge on and a basic understanding of Japanese legal system from comparative legal viewpoint. The course starts with a description of fundamental perspectives in comparative law.
