## Course Description

This course traces the cultural similarities and spiritual affinities between Japan and India beginning in the sixth century with the arrival of Indian saint Bodhisena to Nara, moving to the cotton and silk merchants to Yokohama and Kobe in the early twentieth century, to the coming of freedom fighters like Rash Behari Bose and Subhash Chandra Bose in the early and mid-twentieth century, and ending with the recent influx of IT professionals in the twenty-first century. The course further studies the new financial assistance by Japan to India and economic cooperation between the two countries such as ODA, FDI, EPA, Maruti-Suzuki Automobile Partnership, Delhi Metro Project, Delhi-Mumbai Industrial Corridor Project (DMIC), and other projects related to mobile technology, disaster management, civilian nuclear technology, demonetization, artificial intelligence, and optic fiber networks. The course introduces students to borrowings between Devanagari and Hiragana syllabary and useful Indian and Japanese phrases for effective business and social communication.
