Course Description

This course focuses on understanding and communicating philosophical ideas and arguments in English. The course is designed around two series of recorded video conversations with edited published texts. The first part of the class is devoted to earlier philosophers, while the second part focuses on philosophers and philosophies in the twentieth century. Course lectures include the works of: Plato, Aristotle, Descartes, Kant, Hegel and Marx, Husserl, Heidegger, and Wittgenstein. It also looks at logical positivism, linguistic philosophy, the philosophies of language and science, and free will. Texts: Magee, Bryan.
