## Course Description

This course examines how globalization is fundamentally transforming the meanings of culture. Students learn the processes of globalization of culture and better understand the nature of their own culture and selves within a globalizing world. Topics include the changing meanings of culture; imperialism, colonialism, and capitalism; modernity and postmodernity; the globalization of the world economy and its cultural implications; globalization and consumption; globalization, mass media, and cultural values; globalization and immigration; globalization and tourism; globalization and terrorism; cultural identity in a globalizing world; the ethnic, national, and global in the shaping of cultural identity. Assessment: midterm exam, final exam, class participation and attendance.
