## Course Description

This course reviews the history of the modern world (c.1780-c.2015). Students will look at major themes and examine these from both a thematic and chronological perspective. This course contextualizes modern history by providing a framework in which major historical processes can be understood. It moves away from a Euro-centric position towards a more global history that takes in different approaches and regions. Although the structure of the course is chronological, the main focus is on processes and themes. Students will be expected to use specific case studies to illuminate large themes such as modernity, revolution, nationalism and decolonization.
