Course Description

This course provides an overview of children's rights using a human rights approach in the context of globalization and the child, family, community, and societal context in Asia. Beginning with a survey of current knowledge and research in childhood and child development, the course provides a comprehensive look at the historical evolution of the rights of children. It discusses the main principles and provisions of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Children (UN-CRC), including monitoring and reporting. The course also covers current issues and challenges faced in Asian countries in relation to child rights (e.g. social policy, social protection, education, child protection) and key child rights institutions and movements that have developed in the region over the past years.
