## Course Description

This course introduces current political dynamics of the Korean peninsula and their geopolitical and security implications for the Asia-Pacific region (China, Korea, Japan, Russia, United States). The starting point of the course is the division of the Korean peninsula and the parallel evolutions of North and South Korea, from both an internal (institutions, economy, political systems) and external (diplomacy, external economic relations, ties with the Korean diaspora) standpoint. From there, based on the most recent academic and policy-oriented research, current geopolitical controversies involving both Korea are addressed, including the North Korean nuclear and ballistic missiles programs. Finally, the course introduces current academic and policy-oriented debates on Korea related issues.
