**Course Description**

In this course, students acquire research skills and methods to investigate, measure, and assess psychological research. Students learn fundamental principles of the psychological assessment of individual traits and dispositions. Emphasis is placed on gathering evidence relating to real-world problems that are encountered in the psychological sciences. Students learn how meaningful inferences can be generalized beyond the particular sample data at hand. Topics include research design, implementation, and evaluation; techniques for measuring human behavior, emotions, and interactions; and the application of relatively simple quantitative models to data in order to identify group differences, associations, and predictions.
