#### **Course Description**

This course provides an understanding of the military's role in modern state and society. The focus is on the political role of the armed forces in Southeast Asia. The course examines important issues in the study civilmilitary relations, such as why is civilian control of the military important, what causes the military officers' intervention and political domination via the coup d'état, what is the armed forces' role in political development and decay in non-Western societies, and what is the most desirable civil-military relations in post-democratization political settings. The class begins with the survey on classical literature on civil-military relations, comparative politics and then, looks into civil-military relations of individual countries in Southeast Asia, namely, Burma, Indonesia, the Philippines, Singapore and Thailand.
