Course Description

Why are some countries rich, and some countries poor? What are the political consequences of the eurozone crisis? To what extent is socioeconomic inequality shaping electoral politics today? This course introduces students to the politics of socio-economic inequality in advanced capitalist societies. The focus of the course is on the different ways in which governments have sought to promote economic growth and redistribute resources in favor of different political interests. The course presents key concepts and theories in the study of capitalist development, and uses these to explain economic inequality in Europe and the USA. Key themes include the politics of inequality, globalization, technology, democracy, social class, the influence of business power over public policy, the international financial crisis, populism, nationalism, and the eurozone crisis.
