Course Description

This course critically analyzes contemporary societal issues with reference to current psychological and neuroscientific theory and evidence. It brings together topics from political psychology, media psychology, and social neuroscience/social cognition. Students learn how voters make sense of the political world and how they decide how to vote, how political parties seek to manipulate and persuade through the media, and how political leaders are able to mobilize collective action. They also consider the impact of social media and social networking on how we see ourselves; examine social relationships both online and offline; and explore current portrayals of stereotyped groups on TV, newspapers, and the web. Students engage with debates relating to the role of popular culture in our lives and consider the benefits and problems associated with new media technologies.
