Course Description

Developments during the early modern period, which spans from roughly the late fifteenth to late eighteenth century, laid the foundations for present-day Europe. States took on recognizable forms, merchants discovered new markets within and outside of Europe, and the Reformation, the scientific revolution and the Enlightenment yielded new insights and worldviews. The Early Modern Period course focuses on three, often closely intertwined, subject areas: state-building, socio-economic developments and cultural and religious developments.
