## Course Description

This course offers an introduction to the history of British cinema, focusing on the period from origins of British film to the late 1960s. It approaches British cinema from a multitude of perspectives, examining the role of British cinema in the construction of national identity, the British film industry's key studios and genres, issues of audience and exhibition, questions of aesthetics, and the political representation found in British films. In doing so, the course moves across subjects such as early British cinema, early Hitchcock, the documentary film movement, Ealing comedy, costume melodrama, the social problem film, and the "Carry On" cycle.
