Course Description

This course traces history's history in Britain and Ireland through a variety of avenues. The careers and works of the great representatives of both countries - Macaulay, Carlyle and Froude Stubbs, Acton, Maitland, and Gardiner in England, and Taaffe, Ferguson, Pendergast, Lecky, Gilbert, Bagwell, Orpen, and McNeill in Ireland are examined. And a critical analysis of the great themes of the leading historical works - the Norman Conquest, the Reformation, Cromwell, Empire, and the running sore of Ireland - reveal the degree to which contemporary ideological preoccupations influenced supposedly detached historical interpretations.
