Course Description

This course explores the major institutions, personalities and themes associated with the rise of the Mongol Empire and highlights enduring cultural, social and political relevance in subsequent Eurasian empires. At its height, the Mongol Empires stretched from the Pacific Ocean to the Black Sea, converting the kingdoms of China, Iran and Russia into provinces in their dominion. Course topics include: Inner Asian history; Chinggis Qan and the Mongol conquests; Mongolian successor states in Eurasia; women, tribes and Mongol court; the Pax-Mongolica and the creation of a Mongol World Order. Assessment: oral presentation (30%), quizzes (10%), final essay (40%), participation (20%).
