### **Course Description**

This course examines macroeconomics with a focus on the four basic models: Keynes Is-LM model, Classical full employment AD-AS model, Inflation SP-LP model, and Modern growth model. The course uses the four models to analyze the actual state of the economy with a focus on the United States, Taiwan, and Mainland China. Other topics include macroeconomic statistics; monetary policy, fiscal policy, and government budgets; stabilization policy objectives; money and financial markets; consumer theory; investment theory; and reflection on the rapid economic development of Taiwan over the past half century.
