Course Description

This course explores a wide-range of psychological and social issues related to death, dying, and loss, including the development of attitudes toward death; the psychosocial, and cultural, contexts of dying; the mental life of the dying person; palliative and hospice care; assisted suicide; trauma; and adjustment to loss. Students consider the experiences of the dying, the bereaved, and those who work with them in formal and informal care settings. The purpose of this course is to provide a primarily psychosocial perspective on these topics.
