**Course Description**

This course introduces students to the study of literature, including questions of genre, form, and interpretation, with texts drawn from a variety of historical periods and literary modes. The course explores the relationship between national identity and literature by focusing on four important historical and cultural periods (the medieval, the 18th century, the late Victorian and Modernist, and the contemporary). The course traces and questions the ways in which Scottish writers (including Dunbar, Scott, Hogg, Stevenson, and Gibbon) have expressed affinity, difference, and dissent from both national and international artistic contexts.
