## Course Description

This course explores the changing nation behind the second British empire. The course is structured chronologically and introduces students to crucial historical themes including class, gender, national identity, religion, the impact of new technology on society, urbanization, liberal democracy and the relationship between identity and space. This course covers topics ranging from anti-slavery campaigns to changing conceptions of childhood and old age, from sexuality to the memorialization of the Boer War, from the rise of public parks to mass Irish immigration, and from criminal gangs to the death of Queen Victoria.
