## **Course Description**

This course covers the history, formal complexities, and cultural politics of the contemporary cinema in mainland China, Hong Kong, and Taiwan. In addition to examining contemporary Chinese cinemas, the course focuses on the following questions: How do recent films create the spectacle of China, narrate its history, and represent its contemporary realities? What makes a film Chinese? How are the parameters of Chinese cinemas determined in the era of increasing cross-cultural borrowing, multinational co-production, and international dissemination? How does the transnational constitution of Chinese cinemas call into question older paradigms of national cinema? How has Chinese cinemas become world cinema? Films discussed include CROUCHING TIGER, HIDDEN DRAGON; RAISE THE RED LANTERN; FAREWELL MY CONCUBINE; and THE KILLER.
