Course Description

This course explores the way that war is experienced by different cultures and in their practices of representation, such as war memorials, visual art, films and photography, posters, the media, and humanitarian discourse. Students examine the impact of violent conflict on people and culture, and on the bodies and minds of combatants and non-combatants, as well as how the memories of war are shaped by cultural practices, such as rituals, museums, discourses, and by particular groups in society. Course themes each year may include how wars are remembered and how certain aspects are forgotten or silenced; memorials and commemoration; disability and wounding; experience and personal testimony; refugees, population displacement and confinement; gender and sexuality; and violence and humanitarianism.
