This course offers an introductory but in-depth exploration of emotion from the social-cognitive perspective. Emotions are complex states that influence subjective experience, cognitive processes, motivational drive, expression, behavior, as well as mental and physical health. A number of recurring themes are highlighted, including (but not restricted to), the adaptive functions of emotions, what is the nature of an emotional experience, and the effects of emotions on cognition, behaviors, and more generally, daily life. The discussion draws from various disciplines in psychology, including social psychology, personality psychology, social-cognition, cross-cultural psychology, and evolutionary psychology.
