Course Description

This course covers recent topics of interest in the area of economics and business. This term focuses on organizational behavior. Motivation has been the subject of much organizational behavior research. A large body of research has been done to decide which organization designs and management practices make sense and to predict what their impact will be on individual and organizational behavior. This course involves extensive reading (and occasionally viewing films) about theories of work motivation to understand what activates and directs behavior. The course also examines how the theories of work motivation can be translated into action. Coverage includes topics such as how work design, leadership style, and pay systems affect motivation. By critically examining "why" we humans behave in the way we behave in organization, we are able to deepen our understanding of human behavior in the organizational setting and to develop skills to analyze it scientifically.
