## Course Description

This course offers an interdisciplinary perspective on influences on child and youth development. This course focuses on different societal issues related to child and youth development, such as the effects of being born preterm, minorities in classrooms, and vulnerability to substance abuse. This course provides a broad view on influences on child and youth development. In a series of lectures, experts from various disciplines discuss important findings of child research in their field (e.g., psychology, neuroscience, law, geography, animal models, philosophy, linguistics). Knowledge is integrated by discussing topical issues in child and youth development with other students during interdisciplinary working groups. Interdisciplinary knowledge is applied to a topic of choice by writing a literature review within a small group of students.
