Course Description

This course examines the intertwined histories of the United States and Vietnam within the twentieth century global contexts of colonialism, anticolonial resistance and revolution, and world war and global cold war. It places these developments within the domestic social and political contexts of Vietnam and the US and explores how revolution, warfare, and their aftermath shaped politics, culture, and historical memory in both countries. Topics include: Vietnamese politics and society under French colonialism; the political and diplomatic dimensions of the French and American wars in Vietnam; the war on the ground from both American and Vietnamese perspectives; the long-term legacies of the American war for both the US and Vietnam.
