**Course Description**

This course challenges the received picture of a Viking depredation and Christian reaction. Students look at growth in the 10th century, which sees the rise of Western Europe's cultural self-confidence, culminating in the expansion of Latin Christendom eastwards in the First Crusade. The culture of Europe at the beginning of the High Medieval period and its gendered patterning is assessed. This course addresses how Europe changed from 800-1100 and the conflicting versions of that historical change.
