Course Description

The Greek language is one of the great formative forces in the history of European literature, thought, and government. Most of the languages of modern Europe developed out of Greek and Latin, which lie at the very core of how we speak, write, and intellectualize our thoughts. Democracy and political debate, philosophy, theater, art, architecture, and virtually all forms of literature practiced today have their origins in the Mediterranean world of Greece and Rome. This course introduces students to the fundamental structures of the Greek language, and to some of the most important words (particularly those that have made their way into English) and the ideas they convey.
