To master the 10,000 basic words and 2.000 basic Chinese characters.

In order for students to be able to use all the expressions in an appropriate manner, exercises will be of typical situations where each expression is used, without categorizing them into grammar or vocabulary issues. Vocabulary building with an emphasis on collocation. Improving the four skills of listening, speaking, reading and writing through summarizing, reading and listening comprehension of the materials, roleplay using expressions learned in class, and composition exercises.
