Course Description

This course examines the "Rise of China" by both theoretically and practically examining the increasingly important role of China in the international system. It covers the main features of Chinese foreign policy and reviews various factors that drive China's foreign policy behavior, including its national and international priorities, foreign policy-making process, national security, and strategic culture. The course then looks at China's relations with other major actors in the world including both developed and developing states. It also studies China's "maritime" rise by analyzing its expanding maritime ambitions and capabilities as well as its role in global and regional governance.
