## Course Description

In this course, students explore the consequences of successive language and communication technologies for the make-up of languages (linguistic consequences), the way individuals process language (psycholinguistic consequences), the way people use language to communicate (discoursal and pragmatic consequences), and the way language functions in society (sociolinguistic consequences). Broader theoretical themes include the relationship between technologies and human agency (mediation, technological determinism, affordances, and cultures-of-use), shifting ideas of what it means to be literate, and the local management of mediated social interaction
