Course Description

The second part applies this analytical toolbox to explain the role of international institutions in specific policy domains, such as security, human rights, health, environment, migration, and labor rights. The course focuses on the United Nations and related agencies and programs, with nongovernmental and regional organizations being discussed as well.
