## **Course Description**

This course examines the idea of race and nationalism from a Cultural Studies perspective. Critical attention is placed on the intersection between discourses of race and nationalism and their linkages to global economic exploitation. The relationship between imperialism and the understanding of cultural sovereignty fashioned by the anti-colonial intelligentsia is a key feature and heavily discussed topic of the course. Additionally, emphasis is placed on the connection between the rise of both the modern state and the concept of race, as well as race as representation. Further consideration is given to the culture of colonialism, and the crucial impact of discourses of gender and sexuality on constructs of race and nation.
