Course Description

This course examines religion in contemporary Chinese society, emphasizing its presence and influence in everyday life. In addition to these immersive activities, the course will discuss the broader role of religion in shaping contemporary Chinese society. We will explore how religious beliefs and practices intersect with important social issues such as economics, the environment, gender, sexuality, and politics.
