### Course Description

This is a beginners' course in the Sanskrit language. It introduces the most important Sanskrit grammar in one year by using M. Deshpande's *Samskrita-Subodhini's A Sanskrit Primer* as the textbook. The course also begins by reading Sanskrit verses from the story of Nala and Damayant in Charles Lanman's *A Sanskrit Reader*. The course then reviews major Indian religions and philosophical texts in Chinese translations to know the basics about Indian culture. Students are expected to memorize basic Sanskrit grammar, to start reading sentences from primary texts, and to know the basics about classical Indian religions and culture.
