## Course Description

The course offers an introductory survey of public international law. It provides non-lawyers the ability to understand how international law influences/is influenced by international relations. It offers a detailed understanding of the sources of international law, then moves on to examine different themes in international law, such as the use of force, self-determination and laws of armed conflict.
