## Course Description

In this course, students examine a range of family forms: family functioning, family relationships, and child development. They explore individual, dyadic, family, and cultural-level factors that influence the development and functioning of family relationships. The course covers the main theoretical approaches to the study of the family but emphasizes recent empirical research. A focus on diverse family forms runs throughout the course, such as LGBTQ+ families, and families formed through third-party assisted reproduction.
