Course Description

In the period from roughly the late fifteenth to the mid-nineteenth century, developments took place that would form the basis of the world as we know it today. States took on recognizable forms, merchants looked for new markets within and outside Europe, and the Reformation, the Scientific Revolution and the Enlightenment resulted in new insights and world views. The Atlantic Revolutions and the Industrial Revolutions from the end of the 18th century would permanently change the world politically and economically. The (Early)modern History course focuses on three, often closely related, thematic areas: political, socio-economic, and cultural and religious developments. The course answers the following questions: how did the French Revolution change the political landscape of Europe? What was the role of Europeans in globalization? How did the Reformation and state formation become entwined?
