Course Description

This course explores the intellectual, religious, and political transformations that reshaped England during the Reformation and laid the foundations of the modern Church of England. It examines how theological debates, assertions of royal authority, popular belief, and international pressures converged to sever England's ties with Rome and redefine the relationship between church, state, and society. In addition, the course situates these developments within the broader evolution of knowledge, tracing how the upheavals of the Reformation intersected with the emerging currents of the Scientific Revolution. It analyzes how shifting methods of inquiry, changing attitudes toward authority and evidence, and new conceptions of truth transformed both religious and scientific thought. By integrating the study of religious reform with the history of knowledge and scientific advancement, the course highlights how early modern England became a critical site for rethinking the nature of belief, authority, and the production of knowledge in the modern world.
