Course Description

This is an advanced level art studio course for students with prior experience. Enrollment is by permission of the instructor. This course is in fashion design and teaches the use of different stamp making/print making techniques. The final is to create an article of clothing and an accessory using fabric students have printed onto. Printmaking techniques applied to fabric include calcografia, puntasecca, linoleum, etc.

The course presents in an informal and practical way the various creative possibilities of selected printmaking techniques, starting from the most basic (drypoint, monotype, and linocut on linoleum). It also explores how students can potentially and practically develop their personal interests, with the aim to create a garment and an accessory by using a printing technique. A section of the course is dedicated to the possibilities of digital textile printing and to the preparation of files for this type of product. Throughout the course, selected artists from this creative field are introduced as sources of inspiration for the development of innovative work, encouraging and fostering the students' creative freedom.

This course is offered during the spring semester.
